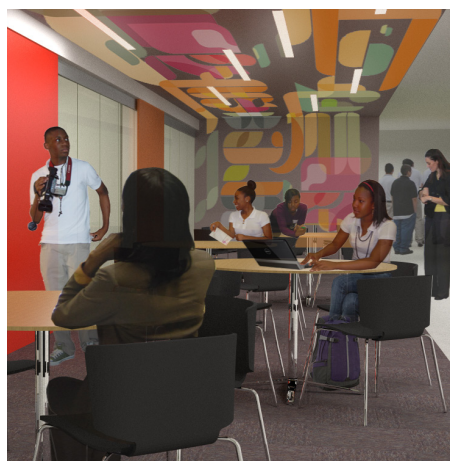
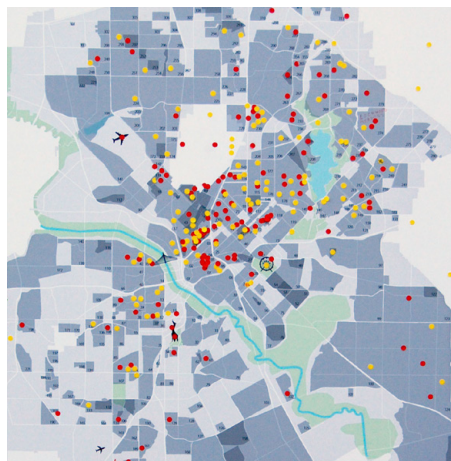


# buildingcommunityWORKSHOP

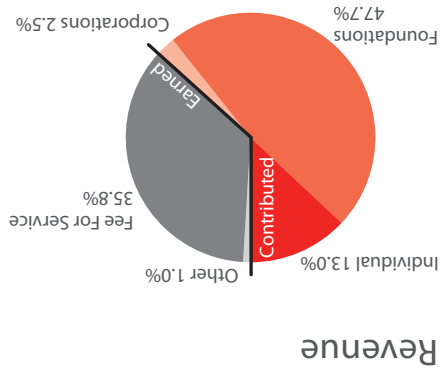

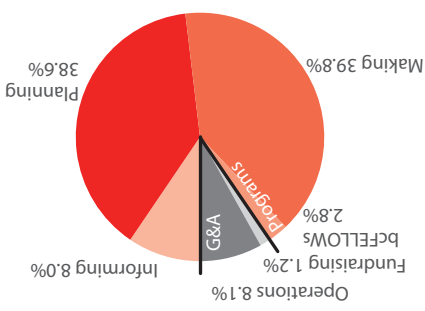
